

TRUMP'S TAX & BUDGET PLANS

TRUMP'S TAX GIVEAWAYS

(Cuts are over 10 years)

\$3.5 TRILLION TO \$4.8 TRILLION: TOTAL COST OF TRUMP'S TAX CUTS, MOSTLY FOR THE WEALTHY & CORPORATIONS¹

- Richest 1% get:
 - Half the tax cuts
 - \$175,000 tax cut each year (average)²
- Trump requires one-quarter of middle-class families to pay more in taxes under his plan.³

NOTE: Tax cuts based on Trump's tax plan from April 26, 2017. Data described below total more than \$4.8 trillion because some tax loopholes are closed to raise revenues.

\$2.3 TRILLION CORPORATE TAX RATE CUT⁵

- Corporate tax rate slashed from 35% to 15%.
- Corporate tax cuts mostly benefit the wealthy.6
- Today, corporate profits are near record highs since the 1950s, while corporate taxes are at record lows.

\$1.4 to \$2 TRILLION TAX CUT FOR HEDGE FUND MANAGERS. CORPORATE LAWYERS & TRUMP10

- Slashes top tax rate on business owners from 39.6% to 15%, helping wealthy hedge fund managers, corporate lawyers, and real estate developers like Trump.
- Just <u>7% of all business owners</u> would get this tax cut.¹¹
- Top 1% gets three-quarters of this tax break—a tax cut of \$75,000 each a year (average).¹²
- 400 richest families (like Trump) would get a \$9 million tax cut each year (average).¹³

HARM TO WORKING FAMILIES

(Cuts are over 10 years)

\$4.3 TRILLION: TRUMP'S BUDGET CUTS TO SOCIAL SECURITY, MEDICAID, EDUCATION & ALL OTHER SERVICES⁴

- Trump would cut nearly \$2 trillion from health care, mostly Medicaid, harming children, people with disabilities, older Americans, and working families.
- \$72 billion cut from Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) for low-income seniors or people with disabilities.
- \$667 billion cut from food stamps, housing assistance, job training, and other critical services.
- Includes other deep cuts to education, medical research, environmental protections, and infrastructure.

\$2.5 TRILLION CUT TO SERVICES THAT BOOST WORKING FAMILIES⁸

- From health care to job training, housing assistance to nutrition, Trump's budget slashes programs vital to working families—all to pay for his corporate tax breaks.
- These service cuts are 60% of the \$4.3 trillion in total cuts proposed by Trump.⁹ Our families lose out while wealthy corporations take more and more.

\$1.9 TRILLION CUT TO MEDICAID & OTHER HEALTH CARE SPENDING¹⁴

- Trump's budget would repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and make even deeper cuts to Medicaid, totaling \$1.6 trillion.¹⁵
- Trump would take away Medicaid coverage from 19 million people under ACA repeal. 16 His additional cuts would put even more patients at risk.
- Medicaid provides health care to 69 million children, adults, seniors and people with disabilities.¹⁷ It covers nearly two-thirds of nursing home residents¹⁸ and almost half of all births.¹⁹

TRUMP'S TAX GIVEAWAYS

(Cuts are over 10 years)

\$600 BILLION TAX BREAK FOR CORPPORATIONS STASHING PROFITS OFFSHORE

- U.S. corporations have \$2.6 trillion in profits stashed offshore. They owe <u>about \$750 billion</u> in taxes on those profits.²⁰
- Trump wants to cut their tax bill to just \$150 billion a \$600 billion tax break.²¹
- Corporations should pay what they owe, just like working families and small businesses do.

HARM TO WORKING FAMILIES

(Cuts are over 10 years)

\$261 BILLION CUT TO TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE²²

- Trump's budget cuts the repair and maintenance of ground, air, and water transportation systems.
- Cuts the underfunded Highway Trust Fund by \$96 billion, losing up to 1.2 million jobs over 7 years.²³
- U.S. infrastructure is <u>rated D+</u>.²⁴ Funding is <u>\$2 trillion</u> <u>short</u> of what's needed over next decade even before Trump's cuts.²⁵ Shortfall means <u>2.5 million</u> fewer good-paying jobs in one year.²⁶

\$445 BILLION TAX CUT FROM REPEALING A MINIMUM TAX ON THE WEALTHY²⁷

- Eliminates the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT), which prevents the wealthy from using deductions and other breaks to sharply reduce or eliminate their tax hill
- The AMT prevented Trump from <u>cutting his taxes by</u> \$31 million in 2005, the one year his tax return has been made public.²⁸
- Trump's tax rate would have been less than 4% if the AMT had been repealed.²⁹

\$346 BILLION CUT TO EDUCATION, TRAINING, EMPLOYMENT & SOCIAL SERVICES³⁰

- Makes deep cuts to K-12 education and college financial aid, eliminating subsidized loans helping 6 million students afford college each year.³¹
- Eliminates after-school and summer programs for almost 2 million students.³²
- Cuts job training and employment services, depriving <u>570,000 people of help</u> in 2018.³³
- Ends funding for Special Olympics education.³⁴
- <u>Cuts support</u> for child care, Head Start, and other early childhood education services.³⁵

\$240 BILLION TAX CUT FROM REPEALING TAX ON ESTATES WORTH MORE THAN \$5.5 MILLION³⁶

- Repeals the estate tax, allowing Trump's kids and other rich heirs to inherit fortunes tax-free.
- Estate tax is only paid by <u>estates worth at least \$5.5</u> million.³⁷
- Just <u>2 out of every 1,000 estates</u>³⁸ owes any tax—or only 5,500 estates in 2017.³⁹

\$193 BILLION CUT TO NUTRITION ASSISTANCE⁴⁰

- Eliminates food stamps for millions of households by cutting the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP or food stamps).⁴¹
- SNAP feeds more than <u>42 million</u>,⁴² including <u>1 in 4</u> children.⁴³
- Cuts Meals on Wheels support by eliminating <u>three</u> <u>block grants</u>.⁴⁴ Meals on Wheels delivers food to <u>2.4</u> <u>million low-income seniors</u> a year.⁴⁵

\$150 BILLION TAX CUT ON INVESTMENT INCOME OF THE WEALTHY46

- Eliminates a 3.8% tax on the wealthy's income from stocks, interest, rent and royalties used to fund the Affordable Care Act.
- Tax cut benefits fewer than 3% of taxpayers. 47
- Millionaires would get a \$40,000 annual tax cut (average).⁴⁸

\$72 BILLION CUT IN SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES⁴⁹

- Cuts Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI), risking the financial security of people with disabilities.
- SSDI <u>supports 10.5 million people</u> who can't work due to injury or illness and their spouses and children.⁵⁰
- SSI benefits 8.2 million disabled seniors, adults, and children with limited incomes.⁵¹
