55 NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS URGE CONFIRMATION OF DANNY WERFEL FOR IRS COMMISSIONER

Dear Chairman Wyden:

We are writing on behalf of Americans for Tax Fairness—a coalition of over 450 organizations dedicated to creating a fairer tax system—to urge the speedy confirmation of Danny Werfel as Commissioner of Internal Revenue. He is the leader the Internal Revenue Service needs at this promising but challenging moment in its history, previously served as Acting IRS Commissioner, and deserves the Senate's support.

<u>Years of intentional underinvestment</u> have hobbled the IRS's customer service while giving wealthy and corporate tax cheats a free ride—since 2010 annual appropriations funding and personnel are down by 20%, and audit rates declined 58% overall between 2010 and 2019, with rates among large corporations declining 54% and those for millionaires dropping by 71%.

The IRS was finally given the resources it needs to reverse this decline in last year's <u>Inflation</u> <u>Reduction Act</u> (IRA). The IRA will invest nearly \$80 billion to improve tax enforcement and customer service, which the <u>Congressional Budget Office</u> estimates will increase federal revenues by \$180 billion over the next decade by catching and deterring tax evasion, reducing the deficit by about \$100 billion. This investment includes: \$45.6 billion for enforcement, \$25.3 billion for operations support, \$4.8 billion for systems modernization, and \$3.2 billion for taxpayer services.

This restored enforcement funding is critical to close the "tax gap"—the difference between what's owed and what's paid—the Treasury Department <u>estimates the "gross tax gap" at \$540</u> <u>billion per year</u>, a good portion of it made up of unpaid taxes of the rich and large corporations. Other parts of the funding package are imperative for improving customer service for honest taxpayers: as of this past December, around <u>10 million returns sat unprocessed</u> (an improvement over 2021, but still a big number) and in 2021 <u>nine out of ten phone calls</u> to the IRS went unanswered.

But this long-overdue restoration of adequate IRS personnel and technology also requires strong and competent management, starting at the top. Mr. Werfel is uniquely well-suited to provide the necessary level of executive leadership.

First, he served in this position before, as Acting IRS Commissioner in 2013. This will allow him to get up to speed with his responsibilities faster and better than anyone new to the job. Second, he has extensive federal financial-management experience having worked for over a decade at the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), including as deputy controller and acting controller. Third, he has served in both Democratic and Republican administrations. Mr. Werfel was promoted within the OMB under the George W. Bush and the Barack Obama administrations. His bipartisan credentials will help him work effectively with a politically divided Congress and defend the IRA's investment in rebuilding the IRS.

Only a Senate-confirmed commissioner has the clout to move the IRS forward on its two urgent goals of improving customer service for honest taxpayers—answering phones, processing returns, issuing refunds—and cracking down on tax avoidance by the wealthy and large profitable corporations, who deprive Americans of hundreds of billions of dollars in unpaid tax revenue each year. That's why it's imperative that his nomination move quickly through the Senate with your wholehearted backing.
